Introduction

The existing St Petrox records for inscriptions on graves and other monuments date from the latter part of the last century, before the full benefits of computer-aided data handling and presentation, and the drawing of maps became generally available. As a result, despite sterling efforts of those who prepared them, the records tend to be awkward to use and are less than precise in indicating the exact locations of exterior monuments.

In recognition of an increasing interest in churchyard records by those seeking out their ancestors, and genealogists and local historians carrying out research, it has been decided to bring the records up to date and in such a form that the information can be more readily accessed and, where an inspection of a monument is sought, it can be exactly located without difficulty.

Whereas the previous records include, in a single list, all monumentation inside and outside the church, this is considered unwieldy and the new survey and listing of monumentation records the findings divided into interior and exterior monumentation. This exterior survey has greatly increased the number of names listed, partly due to the new monumentation of those passing on since the previous records but also because the „Also“ names added to the monuments were often missed. Additionally, a number of spelling and other mistakes have been corrected. Doubtless, this new survey may have errors and apologies are offered in advance. Since the records are in electronic form, corrections and additions that are notified can be readily incorporated.

Conscious that time can only make things worse, considerable effort was devoted in attempts to decipher badly eroded inscriptions. Those on the flat tops of tombs are near universally illegible, presumably due to water collecting and freezing. The use of winter heliotrope *Petasites fragrans* leaves from plants in the churchyard proved useful when rubbed across the inscriptions on light stone and similarly, classroom chalk aided deciphering on darker stone. Nevertheless, many inscriptions remained illegible and anyone with more advanced skills in this field are welcome to have a go at deciphering them.

The following section of this document is divided into three parts: the maps; the list of names; and selected inscriptions of interest.

1. The Maps

There are two maps, one for each of the two graveyards.

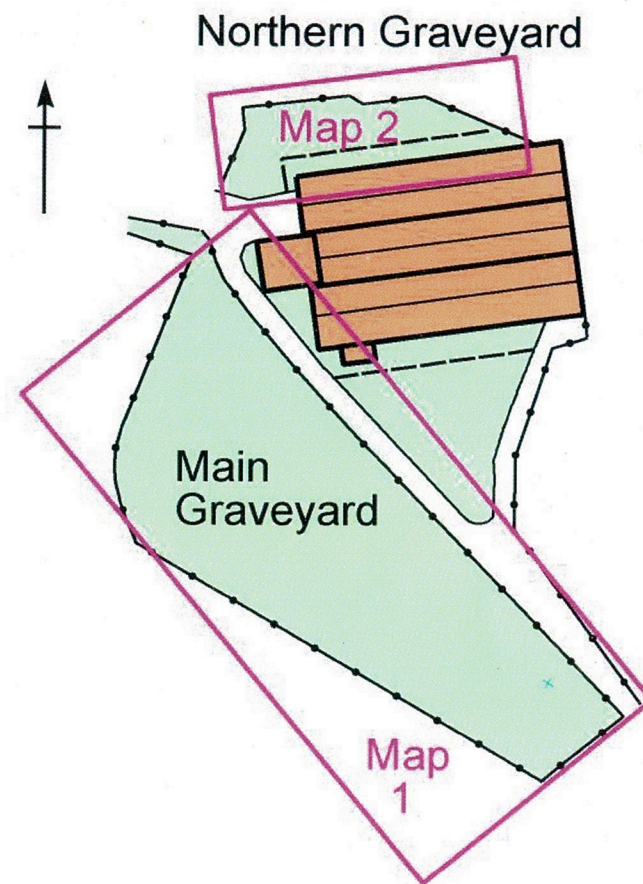
The **Main Graveyard** contains a sparse number of headstones, tombs and other monuments. There are many unmarked graves, the headstones having been removed, reportedly in the 1970s, and set against the southwest wall of the graveyard. Additionally, the northeast wall of the main graveyard, alongside the coastal path which passes through the grounds of the church, has displaced gravestones set against or in it.

To aid locating an item in the graveyard, Map 1 uses symbols which differentiate between the different styles of monument, from simple headstone to cross and plinth. For precise position reference a grid of approximately one metre squares has been added, this grid being aligned southwest with the shorter axis lettered A-R and the longer axis numbered 10-52.

The **Northern Graveyard** is more tightly occupied by cremation plaques in the grass, together with memorials and re-sited headstones on or against the walls to the west and north.

This map is simpler, with just the need to distinguish between the flat plaques and the vertical monumentation. For pinpointing a monument this map also has a grid, aligned just west of north and with approximately half metre squares. On this grid the short axis is lettered S-Z and the long axis is numbered 10-46.

On each map, the lead names on the monuments and memorials have been added, but the font size is small and difficult to read. For use in the graveyards by those wishing to locate and closely scrutinize a monument, enlarged laminated versions on paddleboards are available in the church.



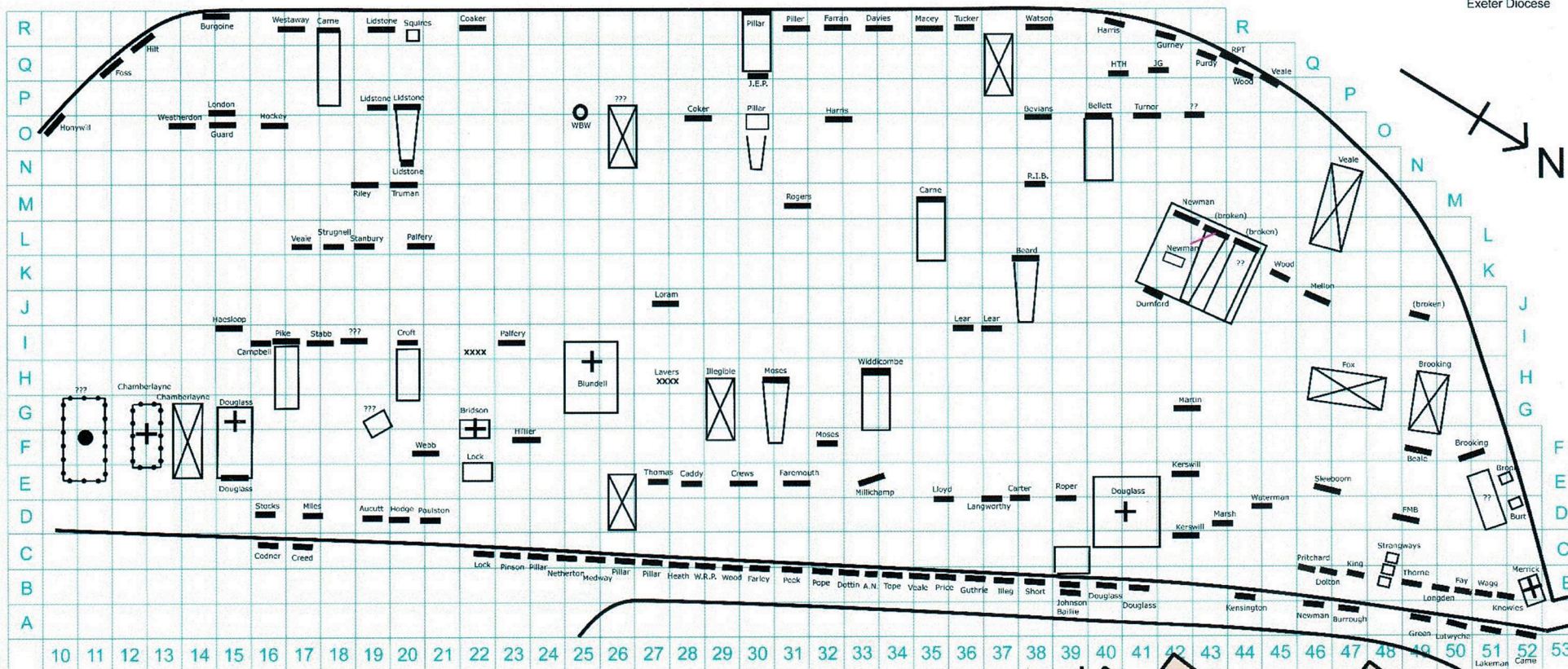

2. The List of Names

The usual basic information on monuments is forename/family name/date of death and age at death. But there are considerable variations, particularly with dates. Sometimes the additional birth date is given which, if the age on death is not recorded on the monument, allows the age to be calculated and included in the list. In many cases just the years of birth and death, without days or months, are on the monument, so the age at death is either of two years.

Often found are surnames of women (and their children) with family names which differ from the lead family name of the monument, presumably through marriage. In such cases the person is listed under the married name but referred to the lead name of the monument which is given on the map. An example of this procedure is shown in the segment below, together with the location coding by the two reference grids and the few monuments against the walls of the church (on Map 1).

3. Inscriptions of interest

Many of the monuments have information additional to the basic name/date of death/age at death, with possibly the familial connection with other names on the monument. The additional text can be of interest and some examples are given here.

The oldest grave

During the survey the most common question asked by onlookers enquired after the oldest monument in the graveyard. The answer for St Petrox is a very large gravestone part-buried along the wall at V12 in the northern graveyard. This is a most strange monument inscribed not as a standing stone but as the lid of a tomb with writing round the periphery. The lead name on the stone is Roger Churchwill (sic). It is possible this is a misspelling as elsewhere on the stone is inscribed the date of death as Aprill Y 14 1740. Also a mistake elsewhere on the stone is the use of „there“ for „their“.

The second oldest monument found is that of Suƿanna, wife of George Dottin of Walfleet (sic), who died in 1744. Note the use of the long „s“ in Suƿanna.

The shortest inscription

Just two letters J.G. at Q42. Further down the stone is the even briefer S G, without the full stops.

The longest inscription

There are several contenders but the strangest is on what appears to be an expensive and stately grave, part of the Newman group of three hollowed out of the slope at L42. This is:

“WILLIAM NEWMAN Sen Esq^e of South Town, Dartmouth and formerly of Ramscombe in this County, whose remains lie in this church adjoining, who died September 6th 1822, aged 78 years: The hoary head is a crown of glory if it be found in the way of righteousness: In the vault in this church are deposited the remains of Catherine and Eliza, daughters of W Newman who died in infancy in February and March 1821.”

There are mysterious circumstances surrounding this grave. The recording on a full-size grave that the remains are in the church seems very strange, particularly as there is no inscription within the church which mentions William Newman or the two daughters. The use of the word „vault“ suggests a space of significant size underneath the floor of the church, but the floor is extensively covered by ledger stones most of which record underlying remains. These are likely to be grave size cavities similar the those revealed in 2009 in St Clement's, mother church of the parish, during its re-ordering. Perhaps there is something underneath the rafts which carry the pews and other furniture? The date of William's demise allows for interment inside the church as this practice was not forbidden until the middle of the 19th Century.

There is also another anomaly; there is no Ramscombe in Devon, although there is such a combe in the Quantocks.

Yet to depart this mortal coil

In the northern graveyard there is a plaque commemorating Sheila Brookes 1920-1992. There was presumably an expectation, his wife have lived to the ripe old age of 72, that her husband Geoffrey would soon follow, so his name is present on the stone as Geoffrey 1920- . At the time of writing, Geoff is still on this Earth, having celebrated his 101st birthday.

Folksy epitaphs

George Martin aged 80 in 1856: **“My glass is run, my grave you see/ Stay but a while, you'll follow me.”**

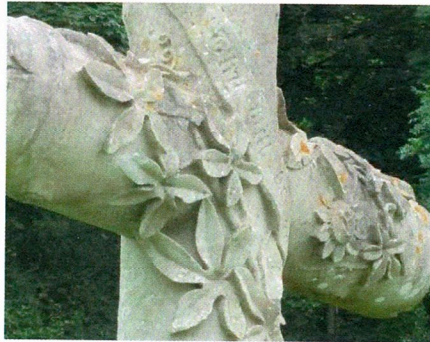
William Lear in 1820: **“Forbear to ask whose dust lies here / Beneath the turf or stone/ Remember thou must soon appear/ Before the Judge's Throne.”**

Class consciousness

There are numerous indications of social class and status. Use of the description „Esq“ is frequent and the mention of place of residence is likely to indicate a property of some size and well known in the community. For example, in 1859 is recorded, **„John Elliot Fox, Esquire, of PARADISE in this parish and of FINSBURY CIRCUS, LONDON.”**

We are also gently informed that, on 30 December 1855, **„Elizabeth Lutwyche died at ROCK HILL, Dartmouth, the residence of her daughter Mrs Tosswill.“**

The lesser status of women



It is customary for a wife to be called a widow when the husband has departed this life, but in times past the term „relict“ was also used. The Blundell monument at H25 has hints of pretentiousness, the ornate flower and leaf cross rising from a cairn and an inscription **„Henry Blundell Obiit [*Latin for he died*] September 8, 1873/ Ann Maria, Relict of the above, May 5, 1886, 46 years.“**

By modern standards use of the term relict would be considered offensive, but it seems that it was once considered a proper description.

A most unusual monument

Unusual to the extent of being unique, perhaps. A single ring of cast iron around a cross, not more than twelve inches in diameter. At first it appears be an item from abandoned mining machinery but it has the standard information: a simple W.B.W., with date of death and age.



Death at Sea

a) The 19-year old J.T. Mellon, on 29 Feb 1848, **„died at sea from injuries received in the galley on the 25th Feby 1848 on board the Edina, barque of Newcastle.“**

b) In the memory of **„William Maddick Moses, Chief Officer of the ship John Taylor, on his passage from China, passed Anjer all well, has never since been heard from, October 1857, aged 30 years. My wife, my children kindred dear, for me no longer weep, for I have found a watery grave, I am sleeping in the deep.“**

Loss of infants

The records appear to show that the most hazardous time of life was infancy and those that survived tended to live to respectable old age. The infant losses were clearly deeply felt and this shows in the precision with which the age at death is given – in years and months, or months and days. In one case it is recorded that Edward Went, first born of Louise and Adrian, was born and died the same day, the 1st of April 1995.

It seems that parents in earlier times consoled themselves that infants taken from them were better off in Heaven. Thomas Nowell Veale died in 1852 at 17 months and his parents placed a Coleridge poem on the gravestone: **"Ere sin could blind or sorrow fade/ Death came with friendly care/ The opening bud to heaven convey'd/ And bid it blossom there."**

There is less elegant verse, whose message is not entirely clear

Thomas, son of Thomas and Elizabeth Lakeman, died in 1826, aged 18. The elder Thomas, presumably, composed the following:

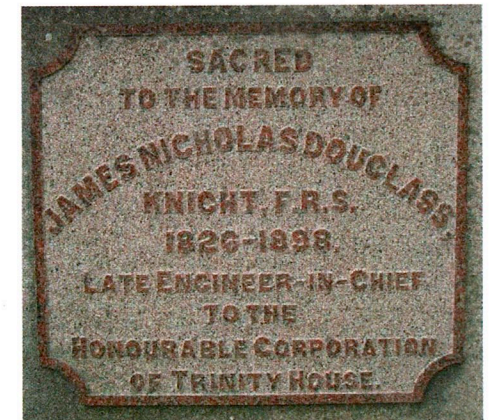
"What tho short thy date? Virtue not rolling suns, the mind matures/ That life is long which answers life's great end/ The man of wisdom is the man of years/ In hoary youth Methusalems may die/ God forbid that I should glory save in the Crofs of our Lord Jesus Christ."

Note the use of the long „s“, archaic by 1820s.

Douglass - the lighthouse man

James Nicholas Douglass designed the fourth Eddystone lighthouse which still stands and operates, the first two having been washed away in storm and the third, the Smeaton Tower, being taken down and rebuilt on Plymouth Ho. He was awarded honours for this feat of engineering and after he died in 1898 at the age of 71 there seems to have been a determination to ensure that his greatness was not to be overlooked.

The cross and fine plinth at D41 has a plaque which is **„sacred to the memory of James Nicholas Douglass, Knight, F.R.S., Late Engineer-in-Chief to the Honourable Corporation of Trinity House."** We are referred to more details on a plaque inside the church, but this has not been found.



The monument at B40 refers to „Mary Beatrice Douglass, younger daughter of Sir James Nicholas Douglass Kt FRS“.

The monument at B41 is "In proud memory of Sir James Nicholas Douglass Kt FRS and Mary, his wife" but continues with

**"Also of three beloved grandsons who fell in the Great War
Percy Cuthbert Douglass Douglass, Ft Cdr RN, died 10 Dec 1917 at Salonica, aged 31;
William Douglass James, Lt R.G.A., died 26 Sept 1915 at Loos, aged 23;
Douglass Charles James, 2nd Lt South Staffs, died 30 Sept 1915 at Loos, aged 20.**

Perhaps with such terrible losses the family were justified in making the most of better things.
